
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# **Civil War and Reconstruction**

1. Gave citizenship to African Americans. (14th amendment)

**4.** A person who needed to borrow land, housing, and tools to try and make a living. Usually fell into debt. (**share cropper**)

6. Gave all men the right to vote. Passed during Military Reconstruction. (15th amendment)

7. The most notorious war prison in the South during the Civil War. Lead by Henry Wirtz. (andersonville)

**12.** The confederate general in charge of protecting the city of Atlanta from William Sherman. (**john bell hood**)

**13.** This battle was fought to control the railroads in nearby Chattanooga, TN. (**chickamauga**)

**14.** A secret group that used violence and intimidation to influence southern society and keep African Americans from voting. (**kkk**)

15. The place where Abraham Lincoln was

#### assassinated. (fords theatre)

**17.** Elected the VP of the Confederacy during the war. After the war, was elected a senator which angered Congress. (**alexander stephens**)

**18.** The act that officially ended slavery. (**13t h amendment**)

**19.** The period directly prior to the Civil War. (antebellum)

**20.** Burned Atlanta and destroyed 18,000 square miles in Georgia as a part of the 'lay waste' strategy. (**william sherman**)

**22.** Large armored ships that were used to blockade southern ports and prevent Confederacy from being able to trade with Europe. (**ironclads**)

**26.** A person who only needed to borrow land and housing from a land owner. Usually made a small profit. (tenant farmer)

**27.** Became the president when Lincoln was assassinated. Lead Presidential Reconstruction. (andrew johnson)

**28.** The general sent to govern Georgia during Military Reconstruction. (**john pope**)

29. The major general of the Union army. Accepted the surrender of General Lee at Appomattox Court House. (ulysses s grant)

**30.** The bloodiest battle in American history. Fought over the southern lack of shoes. Turning point of the war. (gettysburg)

 Issued the Emancipation Proclamation. Was assassinated at Fords Theatre. (abraham lincoln)
 The period directly after the Civil War.

5. A war strategy in the North that included taking control of the Mississippi River to cut the Confederacy in half. (anaconda plan)

8. The nickname given to the group of newly freed people in the South. (freedmen)

**9.** The capital of the Confederate States of America. Located in Virginia. (**richmond**)

**10.** Laws used in the south to prevent newly freed slaves from having any rights. Strongly opposed by Republicans in the North. (**black codes**)

11. The major general for the Confederacy. A huge reason the south believed they could win. (robert e lee)
16. The president of the Confederacy. Captured in Irwinville, GA after the war. (jefferson davis)

21. The sight of the first shots of the Civil War. Not an official battle because no one was killed. (fort sumter)
23. The sight of the official end of the Civil War. Lee

surrendered to Grant. (appomattox)

**24.** Fort Pulaski is located near this city. The North wanted control of this fort to blockade the major port in Georgia. (**savannah**)

**25.** The first major battle of the Civil War. Surprisingly won by the Confederacy. (**bull run**)
