5. Replaced FDR as president. Authorized the use of the atomic bombs. (**harry truman**)
6. Started by Arthur Blank and Bernie Marcus. Lead to the creation of other superstores. (**home depot**)
7. US, GB, France and the Soviet Union in WWII. (**allied powers**)
10. Known for producing B-29 bombers in WWII. Provided 30,000 jobs to local Georgians around Marietta. (**bell bomber plant**)
11. Produced in the Savannah and Brunswick shipyards during WWII. Used to take supplies and soldiers to Europe. (**liberty ships**)
13. Elected to a 4th term as governor in 1946. Died before being able to take office. (**eugene talmadge**)
15. A lumber company founded in GA which is a leading producer of paper-based products. (**georgia pacific**)
17. The Lieutenant Governor when Eugene Talmadge passed away. Became the governor during the three governors controversy. (**melvin thompson**)
20. Germany, Japan and Italy in WWII. Teamed up due to them all having dictators. (**axis powers**)
21. Governor of Georgia known for ending the poll tax and lowering the voting age to 18. Lost favor when the white primary ended. (**ellis arnall**)
23. Represented GA in the US Senate for 38 years. Known for bringing military bases to GA and the National School Lunch Act. (**richard russell**)
25. A person who takes a financial risk to start their own business in hopes of making a profit. (**entrepreneur**)
27. Served in the HOR for 50 years. Known as the 'father of the two ocean navy' due to his will to produce more war ships. (**carl vinson**)
28. The mass murder of Jews and other 'undesirables' by German Nazis under the leadership of Adolf Hitler. (**holocaust**)
29. The event that lead America into WWII. An attack by the Japanese on the Naval base in Hawaii on Dec 7, 1941. (**pearl harbor**)
30. The least used transportation system in modern day Georgia. (**railroad**)

1. Brought major sports teams to ATL. Took down 'whites only' signs at city hall. (**ivan allen jr**)
2. American involvement in WWII prior to Pearl Harbor. Provided our allies with military supplies in return for base rights. (**lend lease act**)
3. The main thing that fuels entrepreneurs. The money left after a company pays its expenses. (**profit**)
4. Won a special election in 1948 after the three governors controversy. (**herman talmadge**)
8. Established an airport in Atlanta. A progressive mayor who made Atlanta 'A city too busy to hate' (**william hartsfield**)
9. The weapon used against Nagasaki and Hiroshima forcing Japan to surrender ending WWII. (**atomic bomb**)
12. Originally sold as a cough medicine at Jacob's pharmacy in 1886 in Atlanta. (**coca cola**)
14. A policy used in America at the start of WWII meaning that we kept to ourselves and stayed out of foreign affairs. (**isolationism**)
16. Largest airline in the world. Started in Georgia as a crop dusting company to fight the boll weevil. (**delta**)
18. Lead by Joseph Stalin. Formerly known as Russia in WWII. (**soviet union**)
19. New Deal program which lead to the end of sharecropping and tenant farming. (**aaa**)
22. New technological advancement on farms that lead to a drop in the number of workers needed. (**tractors**)
24. A person who wants to control a country through the use of the military. Hitler, Stalin, Mussolini and Hirohito in WWII. (**dictator**)
26. Replaced crops as the major agricultural product after WWII. (**poultry**)
